Storyline

Natalia, a girl growing at the 80's under the influence of the Flashdance movie and the soap opera "Cristal" at the far and small city of Tacuarembo, Uruguay, discovers that being crowned as Miss Tacuarembó is the only possibility she has in order to leave her boring native town, and emigrate to a big city where she would be able to be a star; however her adult life, singing for tourists at Holyland a Christian thematic park dedicated to the Bible in Buenos Aires is very far from what she always dreamt: That someday the world would be hers.

Miss sambo. Jacuarembo. Synopsis

Tacuarembó, a little town at the north of Uruguay, the smallest South American country, is the most similar thing to hell for Natalia, a very talented girl who dreams on being a star believing she was born in the wrong place.

Under the influence of the 80's culture, Natalia wants to be famous, and like many girls belonging to her generation, she finds referents at movies like 'Flashdance or soap opera like "Cristal". However, the highest distinction she can seek at her native town is Miss Tacuarembó's Crown.

Natalia's adult life goes on by animating and singing at Holyland, a Christian thematic park dedicated to the Bible in Buenos Aires, Argentina until the day that "Everything for a Dream", a reality show promising to make viewers dreams come true, gets into her life with a great surprise: Natalia's reunion with her mother after ten years who brings back all the unachieved childhood dreams that Natalia thought were already buried.

Miss Tacuarembó is a tribute to all those children grown far from the places where their cultural referents and idols come from, but despite the adversities believe that someday their dreams will come true, because as the Flashdance's central character says: "When you let you dream to die, you die with it"



THE DIRECTOR Martin Sastre

Born in Montevideo in 1976 he lives and works in Madrid. Martín Sastre is well recognized as one of the most influential Latin-American artists of his generation, with individual presentations in England, Spain, Australia, China, Argentina or Brazil among other countries.

He has participated of many International Expositions like the 8th Havana's International Exposition, the 26th Sao Paulo's International Exposition, or the 11th Swiss Image Exposition at Geneva.

In 2004 he won the First Prize at the Madrid's Youth Artist Community ARCO, being highlighted as one of the best artist by the Italian Critics Association at the 51st Venecia's International Exposition.

Advocated to the consolidation of the Martín Sastre Fundation for the Super Poor Art, a web's platform in order to actually support Iberoamerican new ideas, is that in 2005 he created and gave life to the "Be a Latin American Artist" program, by which three artists of the Germany Bauhaus University try to produce and survive with the same monthly income of an average Uruguayan artist, turning around by this means the historical axes of the cultural exchanges between "center and periphery"

Director's Notes

What would have happened if Madonna had been born in Uruquay?

Many children dream of being a star and to shine with their own light. But for Natalia, a girl who grows up in the small town of Tacuarembó, those dreams seem very distant.

"Miss Tacuarembó" tells the childhood, teenage years and present of Natalia, a 28-year-old girl who, like other girls during the 80s, grows up under Reagan's triumphant promises that any person could be famous some day.

The instantaneous success philosophy expanded everywhere through films such as "Flashdance" or "Footloose", reaching also Natalia and her best effeminate friend Carlos. Together they escape from the rigorous Catholic control of the small community where they live, practicing their choreographies at siesta time in front of the "Monument to the World" - a giant cement globe in the outskirts of Tacuarembó – getting ready for the world's applause and ovation; a world they were sure would belong to them someday.

Catholicism and media icons fuse on Natalia's mind. On the one hand, she has a pact with the Christ in her church, who she believes gave her the first color TV set and who she sees smiling at her from the cross; He's her friend and ally. On the other hand, she discovers "Crystal" - The main character of this Venezuelan soap opera, a real mass media phenomenon beating audience records around all Latin America and Spain during the 80s - a heroine and a model to follow after. Crystal is a girl who struggles for a dream against the odds and who, according to Natalia, also sees her through the television set. With Christ and Crystal at her side she is convinced that someday everybody will applaud her, and when she wins the Miss Tacuarembó crown, she will use the award to travel to Buenos Aires where all her dreams will come true.

However Natalia's adult life is unreal and perfectly impersonal. Christ is now a robot and Natalia receives hundreds of tourists at Tierra Santa. There, her spectacular childhood dreams are blurred by a colorless existence and a consistently repeated daily routine where she places her talent at the service of religious tourism and no longer knows what is most improbable: dreams or reality. Nevertheless, Natalia does not give up her expectations and she registers to participate in "All for a Dream", a reality show that makes its viewers' dreams come true and where she looks up of an opportunity: to sing in television.

A childhood with great illusions and a present marked by poor expectations, that is Natalia's life today. Her wonderful childhood dream plagued by media and religious icons existing exclusively for her, with the frustrations of an empty, anonymous and uprooted life, working in a Christian cardboard stone park, where nevertheless, she is not so far from her dream.

Miss Tacuarembó is the story of a girl that wants to be like her film and television heroines and, in spite of the adversities, grows up never giving up because she knows that one day the world will admire her.

This interrelation between media characters and religion is fundamental to the story, where there is a random search for reference icons and idols either on TV or at the Church. At her small-town context, Natalia turns for guidance and help through superior beings like any other person with a marked religious feelings. For her, those beings are not only Christ, the Apostles and saints, but also Rafaella Carrá, Sor Kitty, The 3 Parchis, or the main character in Flashdance. The search for an abstract and almost mythical notoriety is an evident concept in Natalia, because she wants to be neither a singer, or an actress or a dancer, nothing in particular but everything at the same time. She simply wants to shine, to excel, to stand out above the nameless. After all, mortality is the best way to mediocrity and a star is eternal. Christ is the maximum star of her personal "star-system", and if only for just fifteen minutes, Natalia wants to be immortal and she wants those 15 minutes of fame.

To stand out in a small town is almost a crime and Natalia knows it. But she cannot stop; she wants to accomplish this no matter what. At the Monument to the World, at the city's suburbia, Natalia finds her secret place where she and her best friend Carlos, who is discriminated by all Tacuarembó for being a cissy and whit but with whom she shares a natural aptitude for showmanship. They want to dance, sing, irradiate their light and stand out as their idols do, even if Cándida López, their catechism teacher, says the opposite; assuring that in front of God we are all equal. Natalia and Carlos know that it is a lie; after all, Christ brought them the Color Television Set they asked so hard for.

Miss Tacuarembó could be a Musical, a Religious Musical, a Romantic or Classical Comedy, a Thriller, a Movie, or a Video clip, because that is precisely what it is: everything at the same time. This is possibly a multi-genre audiovisual we could define as a Pop Comedy, directed to a generation of viewers that are used to a more dynamic and multi-referential narrative style.



Miss Tacuarembo tells the story of Natalia, a girl who always standed out for her talent, carisma and beauty in a small community where standing out is not very well seen, and is rejected by children and adults, dont really knowing why.

Natalia appears in two very different moments of her life

On one side, Natalia, the girl and adolescence, determined and energetic, that never takes no for an answer and stands for what she believes in. And on the other side, Natalia, the adult, that even though she preserves her singing talent and carisma, she is now a fearful and doubtful woman, that feels defeated by a reality that feels really different of what she always dreamt about.

When she gains consciousness of her mediatic-religious dreams, and about her present life that appears to have no future, is that the famous line of Flashdance, that should have never leave her mind, comes right back "if you let your dream to die you will die with it"

She's an aquarius, vegetarian and she gets late to every place she goes.

Characters

CARLOS

Slim, dark skinned, weak and asmathic. With big bright eyes that always wear glasses, Carlos is Natalias dreamer buddy and best friend. He's a big Diva fan, divas like Madonna and Rafaela Carra. A dance and singing lover thats pointed as homosexual in the small comunity he lives in, and that obliged him to sneak out to play with natalia

Always ruled by his feelings, Carlos is Natalia's personal support, someone she can rely on and who she sees reflected on. Now a days, dyed as a blond, he's a fashion designer and lives with Natalia in Buenos Aires.

Carlos is a Libra, he enjoys following different fashion styles and has a gift for dressmaking. Natalia was always carlos shelter to a world that feels violent to him.

HAYDEE

Natalia's mother. A lady of simple inclinations, her face without make up and her nun smelling perfume, betrays her: she was a catechist.

Frail looking and with soft voice, Haydeé is actually a great woman that's always fighting and working for her daughter's well-being, Natalia is her blessing.

Haydeé holds the most positive and supportive aspects of catholic faith and trys to make Natalia grow in freedom. Nevertheless her Christian values and her taste for insignificant things in life attempt against Natalia's huge aspirations, and was a big reason why she decided to leave her when she reached her legal age.

Haydeé is also a Libra, dreamer, nature lover and even though she once had dreams of becoming a professional dancer, her faith obliged her to become a catechist

Mother of the twins, catechist, a very severe and strict woman. She's always impecable looking, and it's not strange to see her carrying a woolen coat "just in case it gets cold", she's always

A bad anal stage is the reason why Cándida is so fearly demanding and meticulous, and why she freaked out so bad and decided to kill Natalia when se found out she was the one who stoled her daugther's Walkie Talkies

Mystic and perverse, murderess and inquisitor, drastic, in Cándida, Natalia founds every fear that religion created in her as



Was born in Montevideo, Uruguay in 1977, she is actress and singer, she made most of her career in Argentina. She worked at a diversity of soap operas and movies, and she has a parallel career as a singer.

At 16 she moved to Buenos Aires where she started her acting career. She first worked at TV advertisements and the successful soap operas like "Unconquerable Heart", "Sweet Ana", "90-60-90 Models" and "The Rich and The Famous"

In 1998 she was one of the main characters of the movie "An argentine in New York" and started her pop singing career and she turned to be the firs Uruguayan artist who was nominated for the Latino Grammy Awards.

In 1998 she also had a protagonist role at the soap opera "Brave Doll" interpreting Miracles, the "Cholito", that soap opera was very successful in the River plate as well as in Russia, Rumania, and Israel. Natalia Oreiro was nominated as the best actress for the Martin Fierro Awards in those two years.

The soap opera in whish her character was an orphan maid, had also her first record's hit "Cambio Dolor" as the musical curtain.

In 2002 she married to Ricardo Mollo, leader of the argentine Rock Band "Divididos"
In 2006 she return to work with Facundo Arana, who also had worked at "Brave Doll", at comedy "You are my Life" having very

important rating levels at 9 PM. That program also had with Natalia's version of Gilda's song "Daring Hard" as the musical curtain. The following year she receives the Marin Fierro Award as the "Best Comedy Actress" because of her participation on that soap opera. In 2007 she creates with her sister "Las Oreiro" her own clothes brand.


Mirella Pascual As "Haydeé"


Divina Gloria

As "Mónica"


